told his disciples that they will be his witnesses. I think tradition feel like we have not done too well at this. We Jesus. I think part of that comes from the fact that we witness for the last couple hundred years. Immigration,

large families, and people moving into our area have all helped us be sustained and even grow as a church. We mostly just needed to keep our doors open and welcome those coming in. As those sources dry up, we would do well looking again at what it means to witness.

Witnessing is reporting what we have seen and heard. It is a speaking to what we have experienced. The witnessing that Jesus asked his disciples to do was witnessing to him. It is not a theological discussion so much as a personal telling of what we have seen, heard and experienced of Jesus.

Jesus told them that they will be his witnesses. It was a statement of fact and not a wish. We are in fact witnessing. We are witnessing to our neighborhood children through our Children's Learning Center. They hear Bible stories and sing Christian songs. As much as we do not directly talk about Jesus in our social outreach, people can still know we are Christians by our love. We are witnessing through social media through posting video on Facebook from members talking about their faith. We hope to expand our witnessing there.

I also believe that God would have us expand our witnessing through inviting. Inviting implies that we have experienced something worth sharing. In John 1, Andrew invited Nathanael to meet Jesus saying,

"Come and see." Come and see that there is community where you can be known and loved. Come and see that there is a community reaching out to serve the least ones. Come and see that somehow in the midst of them is the Risen Lord. Come and see that in a world of trouble and sorrow that God is gracious to you. Come and see how God has the last word even in the face of death through our Risen Jesus. Witness happens as we invite someone to come and see.

Building Committee Update

The Building Committee was hard at work in March and April reviewing design drawings, considering options, and preparing for the release of the construction package for bids. This should happen about the time this Newsletter is distributed. We anticipate that bid review will be complete by the end of May with a Congregational Meeting scheduled for June 5 (9:15 AM) to approve the selected contractor and financing. Please put this important date on your calendar. If all goes as planned, construction could start mid-June with completion by late summer.

As a reminder, the plans include upgrading the bulk of the facility south of the hallway that connects the Fellowship Hall with the patio. The plans include new wall finishes, windows, window coverings, floor coverings lighting, and electrical wiring. The bathrooms in that area will be completely renovated and the kitchen will also be renovated. The second major phase of the project will include new floor coverings in the Fellowship Hall, Library, Conference Room, and Sanctuary areas plus new paint and window coverings in the Sanctuary. Work on a portion of this phase will be delayed until sufficient Capital Campaign donations are received.

The lead and asbestos testing results identified locations where problems exist. The good news is that the plans already had accounted for the possibility of contamination or we have been able to slightly modify plans to accommodate the results of the findings without incurring significant expense. This basically removes a big question mark from the project.

Capital Campaign contributions continue to be received at a fairly steady rate. So far 19 contributors have completed their pledges. THANKS! We will continue to monitor the amount of contributions received and then adjust the amount of work completed this summer to the funds available.

The facility will be a construction zone this summer. The CLC will occupy the bulk of the Lower Level. Fellowship Hall users will not have use of the kitchen. At times, other parts of the church facility will not be available. Hence, other than for Sunday Services, there will be very limited availability of this facility this summer. Please plan accordingly. Once the construction schedule is known, limited scheduling will be possible.




Notes from the Music Room

As Lutherans, we are proud to have a liturgical focus in our worship. There is a pattern to our worship service, and we use centuries-old words to express our faith. The words are familiar; they anchor us. Ritual still has meaning. The very young and those on death's

door know the words of the Lord's Prayer and the Creeds; these words bring us back to that place of togetherness. But sometimes we need to hear them in a new way. This year we have begun a new method of planning. We now have a worship planning team made of lay and clergy of a mix of ages, musical tastes, musical abilities, and personalities. Liturgy comes from a Greek word that means "work for the people," and our goal is to help the liturgy serve each of us as the people of God. Together, the team studies the upcoming readings and decides on what prayers, music, and changes to worship could best bring out God's message in the upcoming seasons. An unchanging liturgy is boring and doesn't speak to each scripture, to each season, or to each believer. Martin Luther once said, "Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise. The gift of language combined with the gift of song was given to man that he should proclaim the Word of God through Music." He also believed that musical "notes bring the text to life." I hope that our work helps bring the Word of God to life in your life!

One of the organizations that Ascension supports is Mosaic. Mosaic is an affiliated social ministry organization of the ELCA. It was formed in 2003 by the consolidation of Bethphage and Martin Luther Homes, both of which were Lutheran ministries dedicated to the needs of people with disabilities and founded in Nebraska.

Mosaic is a faith-based organization serving more than 3,700 people with intellectual disabilities in 36 agencies located in 10 states. They also participate in international outreach, governmental affairs and church relations to fulfill their mission of, "Embracing God's call to serve in the world, Mosaic advocates for people with intellectual disabilities and provides opportunities for them to enjoy a full life."

As part of their mission to help support people with intellectual disabilities and empower the pursuit of their goals, some of the services that they provide are, affordable, accessible housing, children's services, vocational & skills training, host homes/foster care, 24/7 residential or hourly supported care, and job coaching and placement. Our local agency is currently looking at reaching out to Pueblo and possibly Castle Rock to work with those in need in those communities.
