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Living into Our Vision

We have a draft vision statement: **Transformed by God's grace, the people of Ascension shine God's light**


into the darkness. A visual image for this vision is our Christmas Eve Candlelight service. The pastor and deacon light candles from the Christ candle on the altar. They pass that light to ushers who then pass it to those in aisle seats. People pass that light down their rows until everyone has a light. We hold them up together and shine light into the darkness.

An important question around any vision is, "How do we live into it?" What would it look like for you to shine God's light in darkness? We came up with three measures of that. I am sure we could come up with more. But three big ones are enough for us to work for in the next 7 years.

The first measure of light shining is **belonging**. Few things light us up like feeling we belong in a faith community. I understand belonging as more nuanced than a yes or no. I think putting our sense of belonging on a scale of 1 to 10 would give us a better picture. In this scale, marking 1 would mean you don't feel like you belong and marking 10 means you feel like you deeply belong. Marking 5 would mean you are in the middle between belonging and not belonging. Where are you on this scale? What might move you toward greater belonging?

The second measure is **faith support**. Faith is our trust in God's gracious love for us and God's leading of our lives. Again, I believe that a scale of 1 to 10 would help with this. Marking 1 would mean that you feel like there is no support for your faith. Marking 5 would mean that there is some support and marking 10 would be great support for your faith. Where would you be on this faith support scale? What would help us do better at supporting your faith?

The third measure in having our light shine is through **purpose-filled living**. Jesus told us to let our light so shine before others that they see our good works and



glorify our Father in heaven. Knowing that our lives have a purpose from God will bring us to shine with good works. On a scale of 1 to 10 where 1 means you don't feel like your life has any purpose and 10 being your life has great purpose from God, what number would you pick? Why? What would help you move to 6 or better?

As much as there is more to say about this vision, I find these three measures give us a good place to begin in living into it.

The CLC was awarded a \$7,500 state grant to help pay for their new playground equipment!



Ascension Organ Replacement Status

We need to replace our existing pipe organ. Last summer, we formed an Organ Evaluation Team led by Jim Melzer to evaluate our current organ to determine its continued viability. They determined that it is on its last legs and cannot be effectively repaired. The electronics in the organ have failed. This includes the electronic speakers and electronic component responsible for tuning the electronic bass sound added to the ranks of pipes. It also includes the electronics in the console that control the signal to the pipes, pedalboard and keyboard. The pipes have not failed. The pipes are the same as they were when they were installed. They are a collection of 5 ranks of pipes from various organs not meant to speak together as an ensemble. Because the number of pipes is not adequate for the size of our sanctuary, the pipes were voiced very aggressively and raw to fill the space required for congregational singing. The pipes we have are used over and over again to create sounds in various octaves. This creates a tuning problem and the organ sounding "loud" when it is really just trying to fill the room with its limited capability. The other tuning issues stem from blowing air into the pipes from a separate room (the choir room) that does not have the same temperature as the room where the pipes are housed (the sanctuary) and a very low quality oboe that does not retain tuning.



We've now formed a new team called the Organ Replacement Team to develop replacement options for our current pipe organ. This new team, led by Rich Johnson, includes Jim Melzer and Gail Tucker from the original Organ Evaluation Team as well as Rich Gaona, Dennis Bagenstos, Sandra Bankes, Alice DeLoughry, and Sue Trinko. This team plans to present their options to our congregation in early May. Following these presentations, they will work with our congregation to determine which option best meets our needs and our budget.

Current thoughts are to fund our replacement organ through a fundraising campaign that would begin in the Fall of 2019. We'll form a third team at that time to lead the fundraising effort.

Decisions surrounding our music programs have the potential to get very passionate. We are taking a deliberate approach to this process so we can look at all options and get a clear understanding of our congregation's needs, concerns, and willingness to fund a new organ. Please stay engaged in this process and let your desires and concerns be known to the Organ Replacement Committee and our church Council.
