### **Time for Sacred Moments**



Recently, we hosted Pastor David and Gloria Anderson to speak to us about the importance of faith formation in the

home. They have written books and spoke at many conferences about this. Faith formation is what we do to impart and support our faith. As Christians, we are people of faith and want to spread that faith. Yet, I find the term, faith formation, doesn't inspire me.

My wife noted that a lot of what we are doing with faith formation is making time for sacred moments. Sacred moments are those moments where we experience something of the holy and divine. I long for sacred moments. They inspire and deepen us in our life with God.

The space and time we create for worship are in support of sacred moments. Through visuals of the cross, altar, altar paraments and so forth, we are creating space to help us connect with the holy and divine. Most importantly, God works through the Word, Holy Communion and Baptism to connect us to sacred moments where we know God's gracious love for us. Through songs, music, prayers, and offering, we are responding to the holy and divine love.

David and Gloria Anderson lifted up how critical it is to our faith to have sacred moments in the home. The sacred moments that we have gathered in the church draw from the sacred moments we have gathering at home. For this reason, their ministry is to guide and offer resources to create the time and space for sacred moments at home. For those of you living alone, they would say home is whoever you have your closest relationships with. They recommend and provide resources for doing four practices: 1. Caring Conversations, 2. Devotions (scripture reading, reflection and prayer), 3. Service and 4. Ritual and Traditions. One of their resources is in our bulletin each week, "Sharing God's Story." Take that home and try starting with the Caring Conversation at your meal time. There are sacred moments for you.

- Pastor Daniel Smith opened the meeting with a reading from Matthew 10 that highlights how we welcome Jesus when we welcome others. Council members shared specific times in their lives that they felt welcomed.
- Ann Marie Hindley reported healthy financial figures but noted the CLC continues to struggle with revenues at 84% of budget. She also noted CLC expenses were at 88% of budget so that while revenue is down, so are expenses. Additionally, Ann Marie made a \$50,000 mortgage payment in the month of March per the wishes of Clara Remele's estate.
- Brad Chewakin shared plans for two repairs that will be funded from the Capital Replacement Fund: two windows in the sanctuary and a boot replacement to the elevator.
- Pastor Dan presented his thoughts on a book, "Community: The Structure of Belonging" by Peter Block. The topic applies to our mission and visioning goals by emphasizing community and belonging.
- John Hayes announced the completion of the Waypoint Visioning team and the start-up of the Belonging Pathway Team that will be led by Andy Saunders. The rest of the team will be formed in the coming month.
- Donna started an on-going review of church policies with a look at the Child and Youth Protection Policy. Directors were asked to work with Arlayne in the church office to ensure paperwork is complete for all who need background checks.
- Pastor Dan Holt closed the meeting in prayer.

### **Sanctuary Banner - Vibrant Faith**

For over a year the worship board has been planning to install a large banner in the front of our sanctuary to bring color and life to our worship space. The executive committee designated existing memorial funds for the banner and the worship board set up a team to determine options. We decided to wait until the sanctuary remodel was completed to ensure the banner design would incorporate the new look of the sanctuary. Beginning in the fall, after the carpet was installed and the window coverings finished, the worship board created a team to research and interview potential banner artists. After selecting an artist, another small team worked with her to create a design for a banner on the front wall of the sanctuary that extends from near the ceiling to and around the cross. It incorporates all colors of the church seasons and works well with the cross and the natural view out our windows. The design isn't quite ready to show to the congregation, but it is beautiful.

While the banner process was underway, a separate process evaluating the organ began. As you now know, we are looking at organ replacement options, and some of those options include an organ placed at the front of the sanctuary. An organ is a much larger investment and integral piece to the worship life of Ascension. So, if we decide to move forward with an organ with the pipe ranks placed at the front of the sanctuary, the banner will be altered to fit with the pipes, or we won't place a banner at the front. If we decide not to have an organ with pipe ranks placed at the front of the sanctuary, then the banner will be made and installed sometime this summer. Either way, we look forward to visually enhancing our worship space.

If you have questions about the banner or the organ, please speak with me or the organ survey team. Better yet, come to the May 5th presentation!

### **Spiritual Gifts in Motion – A New Journey Begins**

The Board of Stewardship is pleased to announce that the Ascension Time and Talent Program is underway for 2019 with our **Spiritual Gifts in Motion** Campaign! We will be kicking off this year's program with food, fellowship, and information; between services on Sunday, May 19.

In the past, we asked that all members identify those areas where they felt they could give of their time and talent. The traditional approach was to complete a survey, where specific service opportunities were listed. It always proved to be an efficient way to reach out, but it tended to feel a little uninspired.

For the Spiritual Gifts in Motion 2019 Program, we invite you to join us on a journey of self-discovery. We will use the process created by Midland Lutheran College in their "A Spiritual Gifts Inventory" booklet. This program has been used by the ALC Youth Group in the past.

Our new approach no longer asks "what do you want to do?" Rather we ask "what are your spiritual gifts?" There are 24 spiritual gift areas identified in the Midland program. It is our intent to guide the ALC congregation on a journey to learn what each gift entails and how it can be applied within as well as outside the church. The goal is not reaching the destination, but rather enjoying the journey.

This new approach requires additional effort and a longer period of time. This said; we will be leading a journey across a period of four months. We will launch the journey at the May 19<sup>th</sup> between-services event and will culminate with distribution and collection of the new Spiritual Gifts Inventory in late September.

In preparation for our journey together; we are pleased to briefly introduce the following 24 spiritual gifts:
