# **Over and Above for Faithful Community**

Over the last two years, we have worked with a professional consultant to help us discern our mission. With your input into that discerning process, we named our mission to be "In God's grace, Ascension creates faithful community." We determined the three hallmarks of



faithful community to be belonging, faith supporting, and purposeful living.

In view of our mission, we are approaching our stewardship differently this year. We have come up with a list of items that will help us live into our mission. We have estimated what it will cost to make those happen. We are asking you to support these specific increases so that we can improve belonging, faith supporting, and purposeful living. Some items include supporting ongoing fellowship for children, youth and families, developing a mentoring program, starting a youth bell choir, improving our social media outreach and subsidizing an intergenerational mission trip.

Why do we need to extend and expand mission at this time? We are in a secularizing time where faith is too often seen as irrelevant or even put down. Many follow social media which we are not skilled at using. People feel pulled after other demands and interests around work and play. They too often feel overwhelmed by their lives. They feel isolated and lonely. They don't know much about God and don't experience the love of God. They lack a sense of greater purpose and end up living for themselves.

Our mission aim is to create faithful community where belonging answers the loneliness and isolation, where faith support helps them know God's love and where they can hear a call from God to purposeful living. We have important work to do in this time and need your continued generosity.

# **Pipe Organ Update**

The Congregation Planning Council has been concerned about the state of our organ for some time. It has substantial issues with tuning, sticking keys, missing pipes, volume control, and electrical components. Since its purchase in 1993, we've invested more than \$45,000 in the instrument and it has no resale value.

A significant number of people have put considerable effort into the process of determining the best way forward. A 6-person committee evaluated the organ to determine if it was economically feasible to repair and, if not, consider our options for replacement. After months of research, the committee unanimously recommended replacement with a pipe organ. Another 6-person committee surveyed the congregation on the preferred type of organ and to gauge the level of available financial support. Through the survey, follow-up calls, and discussions, we found the congregation evenly divided on which organ to pursue and how much to invest in our instrument.

The Council recently learned the electronics (bass portion) of the organ is no longer functioning. While this is bad news, we have found the remaining 6 ranks of pipes still work and should keep working as they are for some time. Ascension is fortunate to have a highly skilled organist who can make a subpar organ sound good, especially to those with a set of non-musical ears. However, imagine what she could do with a new instrument. Also, Teresa is not a miracle worker and, even though we are getting by, the organ will eventually need to be replaced. The good news is we don't have the immediate replacement crisis we once envisioned. The limited functionality of the organ allows us time to develop more congregational unity for its replacement.

The CPC recommends we use our current pipe organ for the next couple of years. We assume some risk with this path. The organ could have a debilitating problem that would result in only piano music for worship. It could take more than a year to plan, fund, order, build and install a new organ. We believe the risk is worth taking. The additional time will give space between capital campaigns and allow us to focus on implementing our new mission to create faithful community. We see this as our primary emphasis for the coming year. In the meantime, I have asked our Treasurer, Russ Johnson, to create a dedicated fund to start saving for the eventual organ replacement.

Thank you to everyone who has diligently worked to evaluate our organ, research options, and help with the survey presentations. In view of the factors stated above, the council feels that our decision to put replacement of the organ on hold is the best way forward. Thank you for your patience and continued support.
