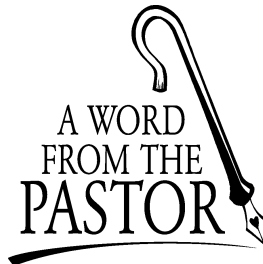
Grounded in Christ

You will be reading this shortly before or after the election. It is a contentious one. The pandemic is not making this easier. It feels like a lot at stake. Our country's leadership controls policies on taxes, medical coverage, land use, environment regulations, military priorities and trade policy. Hearing the partisan words, it can sound like the world will end if the other side wins.

It is harder to lose. If you are on the losing side, you will be distraught by some of the policy and law changes. Win or lose, you will get up in the morning and carry on with your life. If your side wins, everything will not suddenly be wonderful. If your side loses, the apocalypse will not happen.

This would be a good time for us as Christians to ground ourselves in God. Standing on God has been compared to standing on a rock (Ps 18:2, 31, 42). In this shaky time, you would be wise to deepen your spiritual life. We have free devotionals you can use. There are a number of good devotional apps and email resources out there. As a contemplative, I like Richard Rohr daily meditations. Better yet, start with reading your Bible. Each week we have scriptures that we preach on which are listed in the bulletin that you can work with. You can read through the New Testament. And after reading scripture, pray about what you heard and take some time for silence. As much as we are in the world and it matters, let us be grounded in God and God's ways through Jesus.

My second thought is that we would be wise to deepen community. Our Lord's command is to love. Love often means first listening deeply. This is even more important when we have less people to talk to. Deepening conversations go from (1) small talk to (2) current events and ideas to (3) feelings and finally to (4) meaning. Deep listening means inviting people to go deeper than small talk and ideas to feelings and meaning. Conflict happens around our ideas and deepening relationships happens



around feelings and meaning. Inviting someone to “say more” about why an idea matters will allow them to go deeper. The deeper you go, the more you realize you can relate. When the world shakes, ground yourself in Christ and his love.

****Terrace Gardens Bingo – Prizes and Volunteers are needed.** *We will probably not be supporting Bingo at the Terrace Gardens Health Care Center until a COVID-19 vaccine is distributed to the US population.* Our church has been supporting bingo at the Terrace Garden Healthcare Center for about 35 years. We call three games of bingo from 10:00-11:00AM on the third Wednesday of each month for the residents. We normally have about 15 players. We call out numbers until every player wins in each game. After they win, we help them (if needed) to the prize table where they can pick out a prize of their

choice. The prizes are all donated by members of the Ascension family. We could use some of the following prizes: gently used men's clothing (sizes Large and higher), women's clothing (large and Plus sizes), sweat pants and tops (large sizes), hygiene products (body washes, lotions, tooth paste, shampoo, etc), playing cards, some small containers of ladies' perfumes, adult coloring books/crayons, and lady's jewelry. Please mark items as "Bingo Prizes" and place them in the Terrace Garden Bingo box located on the counter behind the Welcome Center. The residents really look forward to our bingo each month and it is rewarding to help them. ***We need to build up our pool of volunteers to help us.*** We've lost a couple of our volunteers because of deaths and moves.
