

Renewing Strength

But those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint. - Isaiah 40:31



The Prophet Isaiah spoke these words to God's people living in the Babylonian exile. Some 50 years earlier, Babylon defeated and destroyed Israel. They hauled off their best and brightest to be their servants. After 50 years of being servants in a foreign land, they were used to it. When Babylon was defeated by Persia, they were permitted to go home. But to go home meant walking some 600 miles through rough dry country. They questioned if they had the strength to return and rebuild their ruined land.

These words from the Prophet were God's answer to their anxiety over returning to rebuild. God would renew their strength so that they can soar, run and walk – in short make the long journey to rebuild.

I look at where we are at as a community and realize we feel weary with being stuck in the foreign land of pandemic rules. Masks, social distancing and limited singing feel like an exile from the life we knew and enjoyed. After one year, I am weary of it. I am humbled and chastened in knowing that I am weary and questioning after one year of inconvenience when they had suffered 50 years of servitude.

Nonetheless, we have some parallels in our returning. There is weariness and wondering if we have the energy and strength to do it. The Word of the Lord from Isaiah applies: "But you who wait upon the Lord will renew your strength. You shall mount up with wings like eagles, run and not be weary, walk and not faint." God will renew our strength to return to gather without precautions and serve directly those in need. In the meantime, we wait in faith and hopefully some patience.

New COVID-19 Guidance for Ascension's Groups

At their April meeting, Ascension's Church Planning Council developed the following guidelines for group meetings. It's a time of uncertainty, and hopefully this will give some direction as to how to navigate out of it.

Ascension's CPC recognizes that each board and group of Ascension is navigating this stage of the pandemic differently. With this in mind, we want to empower group leaders to make the decision works best for their group, while adhering to public health guidelines.

As your group makes decisions on how to proceed with activities, the CPC asks you to:

- Follow the recommendations from local, state, and public health authorities.
- Make your activities accessible to those who are and who aren't vaccinated for COVID-19. We don't want to limit the ministries of Ascension only to those who are vaccinated.
- Communicate protocols clearly before gathering.
- Connect with a board director or pastor to make sure the church isn't contradicting itself with pandemic protocols.

These are the general guidelines:

- Ask people to stay home if they feel sick or have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Encourage activities outside.
- Require masks for everyone when gathering together indoors.
- If you know that everyone in your group is fully vaccinated and comfortable without masks, it is ok to not wear a mask.
- Maintain a six-foot distance between individuals.
- Wash hands and use hand sanitizers frequently. Make these available to everyone at your activity.
- Clean surfaces frequently.

What's Happening

- Pastor Dan opened the meeting with a devotion.
- The Treasurer's Report detailed positive finances for Ascension. Our March giving was up and expenses were as expected. The CLC is also doing well.
- The Board of Stewardship recommended acceptance of an anonymous \$32,000 gift. The donor designated \$5,000 toward specific social outreach programs. The CPC voted to allocate \$1,000 of the gift to Rainbow Trail and another \$1,000 to Mosaic. Discussion on how to best use the remaining unallocated amount will continue at future meetings.
- Board Directors were given several COVID Guidance websites to help them make decisions on in-person meetings and events, as more people become vaccinated and restrictions lessen. Requiring vaccinations to meet cannot be required. Directors were asked to respect individual privacy and allow no vaccine shaming. John will send a note to Aimee Calderone on COVID guidance for Small Groups and Pastor Daniel will update the Ascension web site with that same data.
- Deacon Mary closed the meeting with prayer.

- For those attending in-person worship, singing (with masks) will be allowed starting Mary 2nd. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord!
- We appreciate our Tech Teams for streaming our service each Sunday. It's an invaluable service.
- Our CLC is 20 years old! Join us in the back parking area to celebrate this milestone event on May 21st starting at 5:30. Please RSVP on the website!
- When it come to the World Hunger Appeal, Ascension has got game! Social Outreach crushed their goal, raising over \$11,000 to buy chickens and hens for those in need. Thank you to all who contributed
- Our organist, Teresa Allen, has moved on to other opportunities. Sunday, April 11th was her last Sunday. Thank you, Teresa, for your service and musical contributions to our worship. We are hopeful to see Teresa at future functions with Scott.
- Don't forget to drop off your "treasures" for our Youth Garage Sale scheduled for June 18th and 19th. The drop location is one of the Sunday School rooms in the basement. No large objects, furniture, chemicals, or mattresses, please.

Lenten World Hunger Nets More Than \$11!

The final count is in. Every check, every dollar and every coin from the farm banks has been counted. We raised a grand total of **\$11,075** during this year's Lenten World Hunger Campaign! At \$25 for a rooster and 10 chicks, that's enough to send 443 roosters and 4,430 chicks to families around the world who are suffering from hunger. ****Mercy's Gate – formerly Northern Churches Care** – Pantry items and toiletries are collected in the cupboard in the Fellowship Hall. Ongoing needs: crackers, mac & cheese, oatmeal, spaghetti, corn, green beans, spaghetti sauce, tomato products, tuna, gravy, toothpaste, toothbrushes, face soap.

****Terrace Gardens Bingo** – Prizes and Volunteers are needed. *John Hayes contacted Terrace Gardens to see when they think they'll be able to let us do Bingo at their facility. They think we'll be able to do it by the end of this summer.* Our church has been supporting bingo at the Terrace Garden Healthcare Center for about 35 years. We call three games of bingo from 10:00-11:00AM on the third Wednesday of each month for the residents. We normally have about 15 players. We call out numbers until every player wins in each game. After they win, we help them (if needed) to the prize table where they can pick out a prize of their choice. The prizes are all donated by members of the Ascension family. We could use some of the following prizes: gently used men's clothing (sizes Large and higher), women's clothing (large and Plus sizes), sweat pants and tops (large sizes), hygiene products (body washes, lotions, tooth paste, shampoo, etc), playing cards, some small containers of ladies' perfumes, adult coloring books/crayons, and lady's jewelry. Please mark items as "Bingo Prizes" and place them in the Terrace Garden Bingo box located on the counter behind the Welcome Center. The residents really look forward to our bingo each month and it is rewarding to help them. *We need to build up our pool of volunteers to help us.* We've lost a couple of our volunteers because of deaths and moves.
