The Goodness of Patience

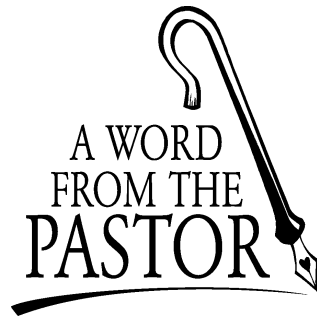

SATURDAY IN SAN LUIS

But when the load was overwhelming, Jesus made time to get away to a quiet place to pray, reflect, rest, and refocus on God's call." (Vibrant Faith Ministries)

Your Faith Formation for Maturing Adults team would like to invite you, your friends, and families to such a quiet place to pray, reflect, and rest on Saturday October 16, in San Luis, Colorado.

The center for the day's activities is The El Convento Inn, part of the Sangre de Cristo Church. We have reserved the entire facility for the day. Upon arrival we will provide a hot lunch in the dining hall for all travelling from Colorado Springs. We are also looking to invite local speakers to share their stories of life in the valley.

After lunch, all who are interested may either take an easy hike or drive to the top of the famous Stations of the Cross in the center of town. The stations are 14 life-like bronze sculptures set on a path rising to the top of a mesa overlooking San Luis. At the top of the mesa is the Shrine of the Stations of the Cross chapel for further reflection, a beautiful sculpture of the risen Jesus, and an awe-inspiring view of the entire valley and San Juan mountains.

In the afternoon, we will provide sandwiches and snacks for the trip home. The cost for this event is covered by your Board of Lay Ministry. It is a two plus hour drive, but well worth the trip. San Luis is just one hour from the Taos National Heritage site and an hour from Alamosa.

What's Happening

- Pastor Daniel Smith opened the meeting with a devotion from Isaiah Chapter 40 with a focus on hope. As we continue to deal with COVID, he reminded us that we gather around a God who doesn't grow weary.
- Russ Johnson, Treasurer, reported lower giving which is normal for the summer; however, our expenses are also lower than budgeted so we are very close to being on target for the year.
- Russ also gave an overview for the 2022 planning process. Board Directors were asked to submit their budget worksheets by September 30th.
- The council agreed to follow the recommendations of the Worship Committee regarding safety precautions for in-person worship. The committee strongly recommends wearing masks for vaccinated individuals while requiring masks for the unvaccinated. The council also asked the Committee to discuss having pre-set metrics for changes to that guidance.
- Small Groups will determine their own COVID safety precautions, as needed, for activities.
- Joe DesJardin, Director of Stewardship, revealed the "This Little Light of Mine" Fall Stewardship campaign which will focus on children's music ministry
- Pastor Daniel closed the meeting in prayer.

- Sunday School Rally Day is September 12th.
- The new landscaping is in on the corner of Holiday Lane and North Circle. Take a look!

- Our solar panel project has reached a dead end. Without tax incentives, we've found there isn't financially feasible way ahead to utilize the alternative energy at Ascension.
- Property and Grounds is looking at outdoor heaters for the back patio.
- COSILoveYou service day is scheduled for October 2nd. We will connect with local organizations for a day of service projects in lieu of the God's Work, Our Hands event held in previous years.

A COVID Perspective

John, I've tested positive for COVID. Not the words you want to hear from the friend you golfed with five days earlier. Within two hours, I went to get tested to see if I was positive for COVID. Then I started thinking about all the people I may have exposed to COVID. That has been my biggest fear during our COVID pandemic – infecting my wife or others. I attended church the day after I was exposed, but that was too early for me to infect others. Three days after I was exposed, I attended Bell Choir practice at Ascension. Thankfully our Choir Director mandated everybody to wear a mask at practice. But before practice, I met with Donna to discuss church business while having a beer with her. Of course we didn't have our masks on during that time. After Bell Choir practice, I had a one-on-one meeting with Ingrid to help her build her Board's budget for 2022. Again, we didn't have our masks on during that meeting. I called Donna and Ingrid to let them know I had been exposed to COVID and that I may have exposed them to the virus. Four days after I was exposed, I called bingo at Terrace Gardens Nursing Home. Thank goodness I wore my mask the entire time I was inside the facility, but I called the Nursing Home to let them know I may have been positive for COVID when I was there. I then went into quarantine with Kathy at our home while we nervously waited for my test results. A week after I was exposed, my prayers were answered when my test result came back negative. I then closed the loop with Donna, Ingrid, and the Nursing Home to let them know that I had not exposed them to COVID. Until now, I have been pretty casual with wearing masks inside even when I've been a part of large groups. **NO LONGER.** I'm not that afraid of catching Covid since I'm vaccinated, but I'm very fearful of infecting somebody such as my wife or a friend. I know the vaccine makes it pretty unlikely that I will catch COVID, but I'm not sure of the chances that I could pass it on to somebody else...particularly to somebody who hasn't had the opportunity to get the vaccine. So why take that chance? Count me now as one who will wear the mask at all indoor group settings. I can tolerate wearing a mask if it may prevent a friend or a child from getting sick.
