

Weariness and Renewal

We have paid a price this last year and a half of the pandemic. We began being disrupted through the closing of schools, churches and other businesses. It impacted those in service industries much more than others. We responded by going online and generously supporting those in need.



But then this pandemic settled in and we began talking about the “new normal.” But behind the new normal were ongoing costs of sharp differences around masks and vaccines, adjusting to changes in schedule and work, and the losses of people, health and many of the fun things that have brought us joy. We became less connected to groups and friends and more isolated. Looking out over our country we see people quitting jobs in record numbers. One big reason for people quitting in the service sector was having to deal with people who lashed out. We have paid a price and it shows in our higher anger, lower trust levels and sagging hope.

What might help us who are weary? Renewing our faith: Faith that God is bigger than our weariness and frustration, faith that God works healing through loving community and faith that God has a calling for us with a promising future. We have special worship services coming up to help with this. On All Saints on Nov. 7, we will remember our losses and find comfort. For our Healing Service on Nov. 14, we will have pray for those in need. Jesus said, “*Come to me all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.*” Matt 11:28

CHURCH COUNCIL



- Pastor Dan opened the meeting with a devotion from John 14. He reminded us not to give into fear when things don't go as planned because things work out in Jesus.
- Andrew Gulliksen attended as a guest to provide details on an Evangelism proposal to purchase a more versatile audio system for both indoor and outdoor activities. Council approved the use of gift funds to allow the Evangelism Board to work out the details with Andrew.
- The Council also approved the use of gift funds to support the Inviting Community Team's efforts. The team is led by Annie Saunders-Pirtle and strives to educate and equip the members of Ascension on better ways to invite and welcome people to our community.
- Offerings for the month of September were down. Because our expenses were also lower, we are still in good financial shape.
- Thrivent Choice revenues are significantly lower this year. Donna Crump will investigate how to increase participation.
- Capital replacement funds will be used to cover the insurance deductible for the extensive flood damage to KPC Kid's Place.
- CPC voted on the health benefits package offered to our rostered staff and discussed other expenses that will impact the 2022 budget. We will review and adjust the draft budget, if needed, in November after the estimates of giving are received.
- The Lay Ministry Board will contact members to reconnect with those we haven't heard from during the pandemic. Scott Allen welcomes assistance from those who want to help with this effort.
- Deacon Mary closed the meeting in prayer.

- The Property and Grounds Board has ordered a new storage shed to help alleviate some storage issues.

Our Endowment Funds in Action

Did you know that Ascension Lutheran Church has three endowment funds? Did you know that these funds exist as an investment on behalf of the congregation? Did you know that the earnings from these funds are available to our ministries, both internal and external?

In the past year, between our General, Youth, and Wessel (seniors) Funds; your Endowment Committee has approved 10 grants totaling \$18,875. These awards have gone to a variety of purposes, serving our internal ministry as well as several external causes.

The only qualification for a grant to be considered is that it meets one of the following criteria:

- 1) Promotes Christian Faith
- 2) Encourages Christian Charity
- 3) Supports Education for Christian Life and Service

In addition, a grant request must be sponsored by one of Ascension's Boards.

Yesterday's congregation members were generous enough to donate towards these endowment funds. It is their past kindness that allows the Endowment Committee to make grants in the present. It will be your kind gifts in the present that will allow the Endowment Committee to make grants in the future.

Please thoughtfully and prayerfully consider making a gift the Ascension Endowment Fund. This can be made through gifts that recognize a birthday or an anniversary. You can also make "in-honor-of" or "in-memoriam" gifts. Finally, larger one-time gifts or bequests can name the Endowment Fund as a recipient for the entire, or a portion of, the sum gifted.

We call three games of bingo from 10:00-11:00AM on the third Wednesday of each month for the residents. We normally have about 15 players. We call out numbers until every player wins in each game. After they win, we help them (if needed) to the prize table where they can pick out a prize of their choice. The prizes are all donated by members of the Ascension family. We could use some of the following prizes: gently used men's clothing (sizes Large and higher), women's clothing (large and Plus sizes), sweat pants and tops (large sizes), hygiene products (body washes, lotions, tooth paste, shampoo, etc.), playing cards, some small containers of ladies' perfumes, adult coloring books/crayons, and lady's jewelry. Please mark items as "Bingo Prizes" and place them in the Terrace Garden Bingo box located on the counter behind the Welcome Center. The residents really look forward to our bingo each month and it is rewarding to help them. We need to build up our pool of volunteers to help us because we've lost a couple of our volunteers because of deaths and moves.
